


Our promise to you


SPCA's strategic focus is on future

Many people don't realise SPCA is the only charity entrusted to uphold the Animal Welfare Act 1999.

On average, SPCA receives over 100 animal welfare complaints every day. But we receive very little government funding to investigate these reports, and rescue animals in need.

Your legacy gift will enable SPCA inspectors to investigate animal cruelty, and seek justice on behalf of animals.

Name an SPCA pet

We would also love your legacy to live on in a happy home. We will invite you to name an SPCA animal, tell us the story behind the name and we will share that with their new family.

Joining Giving Hearts will also help to give you peace of mind that your pets will be cared for after you go or when it becomes difficult for you to continue to care for them yourself.

Giving Hearts Animal Assistance Programme

If your situation changes and you can no longer look after your pet (for example you move into a rest home), you can call on us for special assistance.

Giving Hearts Pet Legacy Plan

This is where animals living at the time of your death, where no arrangements have been made for them, will be taken in by SPCA to find a loving home.

Making a gift in your Will

When preparing your Will, we recommend you seek the assistance of your family solicitor or a trustee company (such as the Public Trust or Perpetual Guardian Trust), to ensure your wishes are properly recorded.

You will also need to tell them what kind of gift you'd like to make.

The different ways you can make a gift in your Will to SPCA

There are a variety of ways to leave a gift in your Will to SPCA, depending on what suits you best:

Residuary Bequest – here you make a gift to SPCA of what is left over, or a percentage thereof (the residue) in your estate after all expenses and debts have been settled and your loved ones have been provided for.

Pecuniary Bequest – this means a specified sum of money in your Will is gifted to SPCA.

Specified Bequest – this is where a particular item of value (for example stocks and shares, property or works of art) is gifted to SPCA in your Will





In Memoriam Giving

A Memoriam Gift is a wonderful way to remember a beloved pet, friend or family member who has passed on. A donation to SPCA in their memory will help look after the daily needs of the animals in our care.

Many families choose to honour their loved one by requesting donations to SPCA in lieu of flowers at the funeral. A tax-deductible receipt will be sent to all donors. We can also send acknowledgment of contributions (name only, not amount) to the family or next of kin.
